# **CITY OF MENOMINEE, MICHIGAN** REGULAR COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS FEBRUARY 18, 2020

A regular meeting of the Menominee City Council, City of Menominee, County of Menominee. State of Michigan, was held on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 in the Municipal Complex Council Chambers.

The Honorable Jean Stegeman called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and led the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

PRESENT:

A motion was made by Council Member Plemel and seconded by Council Member Jones to excuse Council Member Nutter from the meeting. This motion was carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Council Member Jones and seconded by Council Member Nelson to approve the agenda for the meeting dated February 14, 2020. This motion was carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Council Member Jones and seconded by Council Member Nelson to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of January 20, 2020 as presented. This motion was carried unanimously.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS:**

First under communications were two (2) applications from KK Integrated Logistics, Inc., for industrial facilities tax exemptions.

A motion was made by Council Member Jones and seconded by Council Member Plemel to receive the applications and place them on file. This motion was carried unanimously.

County Administrator Jason Carviou addressed council regarding the county millage referendums for 911 and the County Library.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Mayor Stegeman opened the public comment session that was called for the purpose of hearing citizen comments on agenda items only.

No one was heard.

# **REPORTS OF OFFICERS:**

Mayor Stegeman gave her "State of the City" address as follows:

#### STATE OF THE CITY 2019

Good evening, Council, staff, citizens, and guests. It is once again my honor, as Mayor of the City of Menominee, to deliver the State of the City address:

Last year, as you may recall, I reported that we did not have many accomplishments of significance to showcase. This year I am able to communicate positive developments although many of those projects were both inspired by and funded by citizens within our community and small grant awards. We still have many unfinished projects, incomplete plans, and areas of concern.

Again this year the City received a clean, unqualified audit. However, our unassigned fund balance decreased by \$137,000 and the assigned fund balance was increased by \$14,000. Moreover, the projected budget deficit for fiscal year end June 30, 2020 is expected to be over \$600,000. The monies for this deficit will have to be covered by our unassigned fund balance; and will use nearly 25% of our savings. The well-known, mandatory technology improvements necessary to update from Windows 7, in the amount of approximately \$50,000, were excluded from the 2019-2020 budget. We anticipate a smaller distribution from the State of Michigan's Local Community Stabilization Authority. This was established to reimburse local units for the loss of personal property tax revenues from tax reform under the Snyder administration.

Obviously this trend in budget management cannot continue and have our city remain solvent. Greater effort must be put forth to find new, creative, and, perhaps, bold solutions to both decrease expenses and raise revenues. And the time to do this is now.

Above and beyond fiscal prudence, the City has some very serious issues upon which we need to get a grasp: Mother Nature is indifferent to us; we have shoreline erosion problems that need a comprehensive solution. We have begun to tackle this with placement of protection from the wave destruction but we still need to determine how we are going to solve problems in our parks and campground. These expenses were not calculated into the afore-mentioned \$600,000 deficit. We had to cancel a \$46,000 passport grant for upgraded electrical service at River Park Campground due to excess water and flooding and it appears that we will have to delay opening the park for this coming season.

The State of Michigan has instituted a "lead and copper pipe rule" which is essentially an unfunded mandate to replace lead service lines. This arose as a result of the Flint water crisis. Compliance will not be a financially inconsequential undertaking. During this year's budget draft, a plan will have to be set forth.

We are in the process of determining which streets will be repaired with the remaining millage funds, keeping the promises made to our citizens when they voted to pass that millage. In doing so, we must carefully assess the level of funding for infrastructure replacement for water and sewer lines under the new streets. This money will come from the water and wastewater fund balances but they fall severely short. We are exploring funding a portion through USDA loans. We cannot, however, borrow our way entirely out of any problem.

We must cautiously determine the best path for the City of Menominee with respect to the legalization of marijuana. We opted out until such time that the State of Michigan had finite rules in place. That time has now come. Our City attorney at that time, Mr. Rob Jamo, now Judge Jamo, was giving us sound advice. Currently, Mr. Michael Celello, of Mouw and Celello, is carrying out the duties of City attorney.

With the guidance of our legal counsel, we are examining what is most prudent for this municipality with respect to reversing course and opting in. There are a myriad of decisions to be made and they should not be made hastily. We will need a revenue estimate for the council to use as one of our decision making tools but I will add that any revenues to the City will not be a panacea for our financial difficulties.

We have been without a code enforcement officer for far too long. I receive complaints weekly about our lack of enforcement. You need look no further than the tall grass, unshovelled sidewalks, junk cars, and loose dogs to see the need. Our Building Inspector cannot possibly be expected to cover two jobs and it is my hope that we can find a full-time candidate.

During the last year we made planned capital improvement purchases that include: two new Tahoes for the police department, a used pickup truck for the cemetery, and a new pickup truck for the parks department. We have spent funds for the refurbishment of a fire truck and purchased a used street sweeper as well.

Tonight I would like to try to eliminate some of the confusion regarding the conditions for solid waste collection. Waste Management did an excellent job for the City of Menominee but they did not want to renew their contract under the current terms; unless we went to a container system that would allow mechanical dumping, they were not interested. Our citizens have made it clear that that was unacceptable to many in older neighborhoods. We then were forced to look for alternatives. GAD, Great American Disposal, gave the City the best proposal wherein citizens could use either a container in which to place bags, or continue unchanged, setting out bags for pick-up. The number of bags allowed continues to be six, weighing no more than 45 pounds. With respect to recycling, our recycling center will be closing and containers labeled for recycling may be purchased from our two area hardware stores. Recycling will be collected weekly and participation is voluntary. The bulk pick up now will be limited to three items, curbside, twice a year. It would be my recommendation that in addition, we investigate the cost/benefit of occasional e-recycling, tire collection, and hazardous waste collection. The City Manager was tasked with presenting a proposal for a yard waste management.

In the past year the City of Menominee has been the beneficiary of overwhelming generosity in the form of donations, gifts, and bequests: The Triangle Park project was completed this summer thanks to a CUPPAD grant of \$5,000 and a \$7,000 gift from the James Stang family. The City of Menominee did contribute approximately \$3,500 as the project went beyond the original scope. Mr. and Mrs. Burt Shuring gifted the City with a substantial donation for Chief Botbyl's proposed K-9 program. To implement this endeavor, it is estimated that \$100,000 must be raised. This council approved the K-9 program with the understanding that the Chief would privately raise the funds necessary. The large donation by the Shurings certainly brings us much closer to success for a program that will be extremely beneficial to the Police Department and, ultimately, the City. Repairs to the Bandshell in the amount of \$42,600, were donated by a prominent Menominee family who wishes to remain anonymous. Their generosity and kindness ensures that this landmark will remain sound and can be enjoyed by this community for years to come. They have an admirable commitment to our City and we truly appreciate everything that they have done over the years, including the renovation of Spies Field wall and landscaping and the spectacular overhaul of the North Pier Lighthouse.

At Henes Park, the Beach Pavillion is undergoing a complete renovation and will feature a screened porch, indoor facilities for gatherings, and additional restrooms. Also, the pedestrian bridge has been rebuilt at a cost of \$6,900. Other projects in the park will include dredging and repair to the ponds, new playground equipment, and playground surface. As of December 31, the

City has spent almost \$145,000 of an initial \$300,000 gift, which, this evening in a meeting prior to the Council meeting, has been raised to a total of \$700,000, from the John and Julie Henes Foundation. I was fortunate to be able to call John Henes a friend. In life, Mr. John Henes was a generous, gracious, and frequently, an anonymous patron of our City. Through his foundation, that legacy continues and we are profoundly grateful for this contribution that will benefit us for generations.

Lastly in our gifts was the bequest from the Loren Klar estate in the unbelievable amount of \$3.8 million dollars. The directive is that it is to be split between the recreation department and Spies Public Library. Six months have elapsed this gift was given, and I'm hopeful that we will soon be presented with options, including input from the Library director and the Rec Department director, after the City attorney has cleared some of the legal issues. It is my opinion that we ensure our immediate capital improvement needs are met; in other words, repair and replace those things that have been delayed due to financial constraints. The remainder of this gift should be saved and protected so that we may use the interest income perpetually.

The City of Menominee continues to have a presence in Lansing. I serve on the Michigan Municipal League's Liability and Property Pool and received unanimous approval to be on the ballot for a third term. I also remain in service on the MML Board of Trustees. It is an honor to represent the City of Menominee on these boards and I am appreciative of the MML for the opportunity.

Finally and importantly, I would like to thank the dedicated staff and employees of the City who serve our public. I would like to thank the department heads who put in so much extra time to get the job done. They stay late, arrive early, and come in on weekends and holidays. I would like to acknowledge the many citizens who willingly give their time to serve on the boards and commissions for the benefit of our community; we could not function without you. I would like to thank the Council for your public service and look forward to a productive year. In the next six to eight months, you can expect that we will complete road projects, have a website that is more navigable, address economic development succession, have a comprehensive plan for alley maintenance, and have a plan for road maintenance and crack-sealing. This council has put forth a list of clearly defined goals and objectives, including deadlines to which the City Manager has agreed, to use as a tool for progress. Therefore, I have a reason for optimism in achievement for 2020. If we use what is best for the City of Menominee as a common denominator in our entire decision making process, we should be able to reach compromises and conclusions to move this community forward.

A motion was made by Council Member Jones and seconded by Council Member Klitzke to adopt the recommendation. This motion was carried unanimously.

### **BOARD REPORT:**

At a February 18, 2020 meeting, the Henes Park Board of Commissioners discussed the Grant Agreement with the John and Julie Henes Foundation for the Beach Pavilion project at John Henes Park as approved by the City Council at their July 15, 2019 meeting and they recommended to City Council that Council approve revising the dollar amount of the Grant Agreement to \$700,000.

#### HENES PARK BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

A motion was made by Council Member Jones and seconded by Council Member Nelson to adopt the recommendation. This motion as carried unanimously.

# **COMMITTEE REPORT:**

At a February 11 and 18, 2020 meetings, the Finance Committee discussed the Poverty Exemption Policy as approve by the City Council on November 18, 2019 and at the February 18, 2020 meeting, they recommended to City Council that Council approve and adopt revised Resolution 2019-14 as follows to include an Asset Threshold to provide further guidance to the Board of Review regarding length/amount of exemptions issued:

# RESOLUTION #2019-014 CITY OF MENOMINEE 2020 POVERTY EXEMPTION

**WHEREAS**, the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is required of the City of Menominee City Council; and

**WHEREAS**, the principal residence of persons, who the Board of Review determines by reason of poverty to be unable to contribute to the public charge, is eligible for exemption in whole or in part from taxation under Public Act 390 of 1994 (MCL 211.7u); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to PA 390 of 1994, the City of Menominee City Council, Menominee County adopts the following guidelines for the Board of Review to implement. The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property tax credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year. An asset test means the amount of cash, fixed assets or other

property that could be used, or converted to cash for use in the payment of property taxes. All other assets above that should be considered available.

WHEREAS, the Board of Review may grant property tax relief based on poverty annually but no one owner may receive a poverty exemption for any longer than five (5) years.

To be eligible, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis:

- 1) Be an owner of and occupy as a principal residence the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 2) File an application with the assessor or Board of Review, accompanied by federal and state income tax returns for all persons residing in the principal residence, including any property tax credit returns filed in the immediately preceding year or in the current year;
- 3) File a claim reporting that the combined assets of all persons within the household do not exceed the current guidelines asset threshold of \$25,000.00. Assets include but are not limited to;
  - A. All the provisions of Public Act 390 of 1994; and
  - B. Must not own real estate other than the principal residence;
  - C. Must not own any recreational, sports equipment or vehicles over \$8,000 in value;
- D. If a 2<sup>nd</sup> vehicle is owned by the applicant, its use by another family member must be documented;
  - E. Must not own any stocks, bonds, or other investments.
- Ownership interest in a second home, land, vehicles
- Recreational vehicles such as campers, motor-homes, boats and ATV's
- Buildings other than the principal residence
- 4) Produce a valid Michigan driver's license or other form of identification if requested.
- 5) Produce, if requested, a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 6) Meet the federal poverty income guidelines as defined and determined annually by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 7) The application for an exemption shall be filed after January 1, but one day prior to the last day of the Board of Review. The filing of this claim constitutes an appearance before the Board of Review for the purpose of preserving the right of appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal.

The City will follow the federal poverty income guidelines which are updated annually by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The annual allowable income includes income for all persons residing in the principal residence.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** that the Assessor and Board of Review shall follow the above stated policy and federal guidelines in granting or denying an exemption, unless the Assessor and Board of Review determines there are substantial and compelling reasons why there should be a deviation from the policy and federal guidelines and these reasons are communicated in writing to the claimant.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT:**

**BOARD RECOMMENDATION / ACTION:** At a March 12, 2020 meeting, the Water and Wastewater Utility Board discussed the Coleman Engineering Revised Proposal for the Utility Project Loan applications and recommended to City Council that Council approve the Revised Loan Application Proposal to prepare an application for the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) and State Revolving Fund (SRF) for the Water and Sewer Project. **PURPOSE:** A request to revise the loan application proposal to prepare an application for the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) and State Revolving Fund (SRF) for Water and Sewer Project.

**BACKGROUND:** The City Council approved the original loan application proposal for the USDA Rural Development fund on January 21, 2020. However, the USDA informed Coleman Engineering that the City of Menominee would not be eligible for funding (loan or grant) from their program due to a new rule. (See attached Coleman Engineering Letter for further explanation)

There is another funding agency for water and sewer projects through EGLE which is the Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) for water projects and the State Revolving Fund (SRF) for sewer projects.

The revised loan application proposal will remain the same costs of \$20,000 to apply for the DWRF and SRF funding sources. One additional advantage with these funds is the funds can be used for the replacement of residential lead pipe services. The difference between the USDA Loan program and the DWRF & SRF Loan program is the state programs have a 20 year or a 30 year terms instead of 40 year terms for the USDA programs and USDA interest rate is ½% lower around 1.75% compared to the State program which is between 2-2.25%. The initial loan costs and terms the State program annual payment is about the same.

The Loan Application Funding Budget will remain the same except Cooper/Lead Service Lines budget might increase to \$200,000:

Sewer	\$1.383,000
Roadway	\$2,925,200
Replace 25 Private Cooper/Lead Service Lines	\$ 87,500
TOTAL	\$5,830,400

**BUDGET IMPACT**: The estimated increase for the Water rate use would be \$4.40 per quarter/\$17.60 annual increase and the sewer rate use would be \$4.45 per quarter/\$17.80 annual increase based the average household use per quarter. The rate will be approved as part of the USDA Loan process when recommended.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED:** The Staff recommends to approve the Coleman Engineering Revised Loan Application Proposal upon legal review by Attorney Michael Celello.

#### **PURPOSE:**

To repair the damaged and deteriorated portions of the concrete channels running along the bridge's fishing platform.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On March 3, 2020 there was a meeting with Ayres Associates and City of Marinette's Board of Public Works showing the damage and deterioration on portions of the concrete channels running along the bridge's fishing platform. Ayres structural engineer, Chris McMahon stated that there are not structural concern's yet, but if not addressed soon, they could lead to closing the fishing platform. Ayres' structural repair study suggested three alternatives: 1) Do nothing; 2) Patch the existing channels and concrete bracket arms; or 3) Replace the fishing platform.

#### SUMMARY:

Marinette's Board of Public Works and Common Council approved paying 50% of repair cost that is estimated at \$100,000 and requested that the City of Menominee pay the other 50%. The contractor that re-decked the Hattie Street Bridge in 2017 will mobilize before the end of May 2020 to reconnect storm inlet down spouts. They will have their snooper truck and crew in Marinette in May 2020. If they are willing, they will quote the work and most likely be lower due to the fact that they already have to mobilize their crew and equipment under the current WDOT contract.

**BUDGET IMPACT:** The Bridge Maintenance Account for Contract Services has a budget amount of \$125,000 which is for both bridges Ogden Street and Hattie Street for professional services and maintenance costs for operations for the Ogden Street moveable bridge costs. The remaining budget for 2019-2020 is \$37,969.45. In order to minimize the cost of repairs, the City of Marinette would like to have the current contractor complete the repairs in May 2020.

# STAFF RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED:

The recommendation is to accept 50% of the repair cost to lengthen the life of the fishing platform.

# **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION / ACTION:**

At a March 12, 2020 meeting, the Finance Committee discussed the Hattie Street Bridge Platform repair and recommended to City Council that Council approve the Fishing Platform structural repairs for the Hattie Street Bridge Structure over the Menominee River and the City agrees to pay 50% of the cost, not to exceed \$50,000., for alternative #2, contingent upon the Engineers review of the bid proposals.
