PURPOSE:

Request that the City Council approve the selection of MJB Industries, Inc. as the most qualified low bidder and recommend the award of the contract for Brush Grinding at the Industrial Park Property located on 56th Avenue.

BACKGROUND:

Each year DPW picks up brush from city residents, curb side, and also allows residents to drop off brush at the City Compost Site located behind the Water Treatment Plant. DPW then hauls and stock-piles all of the brush at the "Back 40" city owned property in the Industrial Park until such time that it is ground into wood chips and hauled away. A small amount is retained for use on the park trail system. Each year it is necessary to grind the material, because the volume of brush completely fills the storage area allotted for it.

Three vendors were invited to solicit a bid. A single bid was received from MJB Industries, Inc., of Marinette WI.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The amount of the proposed brush grinding bid exceeds the budgeted amount of \$10,000. This cost is all inclusive of all labor and equipment. The cost will be encumbered from the Contract Services Account specified in the Rubbish Collection Portion of the Operations Budget 226-525.000-818.000.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED:

The City Manager recommends that the Public Safety/ Public Works Committee approve the selection of MJB Industries, Inc. as the most qualified low bidder and recommends the award of the contract for grinding brush at the city owned property in the Industrial Park in the amount of \$10,000.00.

PURPOSE:

Request that the City Council approve the request from Tom Everard, dba Dexter's to close a portion of 8th Street from 10th Avenue north approximately 123' feet to temporarily have added space with outdoor seating on weekends beginning June 17th through September 25th. Mr. Everard also requests the closure include Monday on holiday weekends (Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day).

BACKGROUND:

Mr. Everard has received approval from the Menominee City Council for temporary added space with outdoor seating in the summer months ever since the Covid-19 pandemic. Since the added space would be on city property, City Council must act on the request.

Mr. Everard has provided required fencing of the area closed off along with tables and chairs, which he will do again this year with necessary barricades in place Friday through Sunday only with the exception of the three holiday weekends.

ORDINANCE 2022-001 AMENDING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS BILL FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 20212 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 20223

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THE CITY OF MENOMINEE ORDAINS:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 5 of the Charter of the City of Menominee, the City Manager and Finance Committee have prepared a proposed budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 202±2 and ending June 30, 202±3; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to MCL 141.412, a public hearing has been held on said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, the total taxable valuation for all the real and personal property within said city liable to taxation has been determined according to applicable law in the sum of \$212,069,732 223,930,552.

SECTION 1. That for the purpose of defraying the expenditures and liabilities of the City of Menominee, Michigan for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 20212 and ending June 30, 20223 and to meet the deficiencies of the several funds of said city for the past fiscal year and former years, if any, there is hereby provided for and appropriated the sum of \$19,257,281 \$21,127,251 from which sum there shall be deducted the estimated revenues for said year, the sum of \$19,257,281 \$21,127,251.

SECTION 2. For the purpose of paying the operating expenses of the General Fund a tax levy of 14.1421 13.8352 mills on the dollar on all taxable property in the city according to valuation of same, which amount is included in the amount appropriated in Section 1, is hereby provided and appropriated.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of paying the principal and interest on bonds of said city due and payable during such fiscal year, there is hereby provided and appropriated the sum of \$541,766 \$536,646 of which \$541,766 \$536,646 will be levied by a tax of 2.52 1.02 mills.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of maintaining the garbage system for collection and disposal of garbage in the city a tax levy of 2.65 2.30 mills on the dollar of all taxable property in the city according to valuation of the same, which amount is included in the amount appropriated in Section 1, is hereby provided and appropriated.

SECTION 5. For the purpose of paying the cost of the city share of policemen and firemen pension expenditures tax levy of 4.15 4.60 mills on the dollar on all taxable property in the city according to the valuation of the same, which amount is included in the amount appropriated in Section 1, is hereby provided and appropriated.

SECTION 6. For the purpose of paying the operating expenses of the Spies Public Library pursuant to MCL 397.201 a tax levy of .9516 .9309 mills on the dollar on all taxable property in the city according to valuation of same, which amount is included in the amount appropriated in Section 1, is hereby provided and appropriated.

SECTION 7. The amounts provided for and appropriated by Section 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 shall total 24.4137 22.6861 mills on the dollar valuation hereof ordered to be raised by general tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within the city.

SECTION 8. The objects and purposes for which the amounts appropriated in Section 1, 3 and 4 hereof for the City General Fund Operations are as follows:
